SAFETY INFORMATION



WARNINGS

IMPORTANT: The appliance should be inspected before use and at least annually by a quilified service person. More frequent cleaning may be required as necessary. It is imperative that the control compartment, burners and circulating air passageways of the appliance be kept clean.

⚠ DANGER: Carbon monoxide poisoning may lead to death!

Carbon Monoxide Poisoning: Early signs of carbon monoxide poisoning resemble the flu, with 4. headaches, dizziness, or nausea. If you have these signs, the Bonfire may not be working properly. Get fresh air at once! Have the

Bonfire serviced. Some people are more affected by carbon monoxide than others. These include pregnant women, people with heart or lung disease or anemia, those under the influence of alcohol, and those at high altitudes.

Natural Gas: Natural gas is odorless. An odor making agent is added to the gas. The odor helps you detect a gas leak. However, the odor added to the gas can fade. Gas may be present even though no odor exists.

Make certain you read and understand all warnings. Keep this manual for reference. It is your guide to safe and proper operation of this appliance.

▲ WARNING: Any change to this appliance or its controls can be dangerous.

- 1. This appliance, as supplied, is only for use with the type of gas indicated on the rating plate.
- 2. When an appliance is for connection to a fixed piping system, the installation must conform with local codes, or in the absence of local codes with the *National Fuel Gas Code, ANSI* **Z223.1/NFPA 54**, or International Fuel Gas Code, Natural Gas and Propane Installation Code, CSA B149.1, or Propane Storage and Handling Code, B149.2, as applicable.
- 3. Keep the appliance area clear and free from combustible materials, gasoline and other flammable vapors and liquids.
 - Do not burn solid fuel in the fireplace after installing the appliance. Do not use this appliance to cook food or burn paper or other objects.
- 5. Children and adults should be alerted to the hazards of high surface temperatures and should stay away to avoid burns or clothing ignition.
- 6. Clothing or other flammable materials should not be hung from the appliance, or placed on or near the appliance.
- 7. Young children should be carefully supervised when they are in the area of the appliance.
- 8. The appliance, when installed, must be electrically grounded in accordance with local codes or, in the absence of local codes, with the *National Electrical Code*, *ANSI/NFPA 70 or the Canadian Electrical Code*, *CSA C22.1*, if applicable.

- 9. Do not use appliance if any part has been under water. Immediately call a qualified service technician to inspect the room appliance and to replace any part of the control system and any gas control which has been under water.
- 10. Inspect the burner before each use of the Bonfire.

The burner must be replaced prior to the appliance being put into operation if it is evident that the burner is damaged. Please refer to *"Illustrated parts List"* for the replacement burner part number.

11. Turn the appliance off and let cool before servicing, installling, or repairing. Any guard or other protective device removed for servicing the appliance must be replaced prior to operating the appliance. Only a qualified service person should install, service, or repair appliance.

HIGH ALTITUDE INSTALLATIONS:

The appliance is rated for installations up to 4500' (1372 m) above sea level. Above 4500' the appliance must be de- rated at the factory for the appropriate altitude.

Install and use the Bonfire with care. Follow local codes. In the absence of local codes, use the latest edition of *The National Fuel Gas Code ANSI Z223.1/NFPA 54* available from:

LOCATING YOUR BONFIRE

- 1) When selecting a location for your fireplace, ensure that the clearances are followed.
- 2) This appliance must be installed in an open-air situation with natural ventilation, without stagnant areas, where gas leakage and products of combustion are rapidly dispersed by wind and natural convection.
- 3) Certain materials or items, when placed under or near the appliance, will be subjected to radiant heat and could become damaged.
- 4) Typically an outdoor space is not enclosed but, any enclosure in which the appliance is used shall comply with one of the following:

A: An enclosure with walls on all sides, but at least one permanent opening at ground level and no overhead cover.



PERMANENT OPENING

B: Within a partial enclosure that includes an overhead cover and no more that two walls.



C: Within a partial enclosure that includes an overhead cover and more than two walls, the following shall apply:

• At least 25% of the total wall area is completely open, and

• At least 30% of the remaining wall area is open and unrestricted



CLEARANCES TO COMBUSTIBLE MATERIALS:

- Ceiling 104" (265 cm)
- Side Walls 24" (61 cm)
- Floor
beneath the appliance when placed
on top of the combustible materials.

BONFIRE INSTALLATION (EXAMPLE)



Clearance to combustibles must be maintained according to Page 4.

PRODUCT ASSEMBLY

WARNING: Failure to position the parts in accordance with these diagrams or failure to use only parts specially approved with this appliance may result in property damage or personal injury.

- 1. Remove Burner Assembly, and Burner Media from packaging (see **Parts List**)
- 2. Connect the Burner Assembly to gas supply using supplied flex connector and shutoff valve.
- 3. Evenly media fill the compartment with burner media (broken tempered glass) fully covering the burner as shown on a picture. If you are NOT planning to add optional topping media, then fill the media compartment in full and proceed to the step 5.

INSTALLATION

CAUTION: Do NOT remove the metal data plates attached to the fireplace. These plates contain important information.

NOTICE: Installation and repair should be done by a qualified service person. The appliance should be inspected before use and at least annually by a qualified service person. More frequent cleaning may be required as necessary. It is imperative that control compartment, burner and circulating air passageways of the appliance be kept clean.



- 4. Place and evenly distribute topping media (optional logs or stones) on top of burner media as shown on a picture.
- 5. Carefully leak test all connections following the procedure on Page 7.

CAUTION: When using lava rock or basalt stones as a topping media, keep the area in front of the pilot screen at least 2" clear of topping media. Blocking the pilot screen can cause improper operation!

6. Having free access to the valve light the appliance following the procedure on Page 9.

Make sure the flame covers the entire burner surface as shown.



CHECK GAS TYPE

THIS FIREPLACE BURNER IS FOR USE WITH NATURAL GAS ONLY! Use proper gas type for the fireplace. If you have conflicting gas type, do not install fireplace.

INSTALLING GAS PIPING TO FIREPLACE / BURNER SYSTEM LOCATION

WARNING

A qualified installer or service person must connect appliance to gas supply. Follow all local codes.

INSTALLATION ITEMS NEEDED

Before installing fireplace and burner system, make sure you have the items listed below.

- Sediment trap (recommended).
- Piping (check local codes)
- Equipment shutoff valve*
- Test gauge connection*
- Sealant

- - Pipe wrench

- Tee joint
- approved flexible gas line with gas connector (if allowed by local codes not provided)
- * A CSA design-certified equipment shutoff valve with ¹/₈" NPT tap is an acceptable alternative to test gauge connection. Purchase the CSA design-certified equipment shutoff valve from your dealer.

When using copper or flex connectors use only fittings approved for gas connections. The gas control inlet is ⁵/8" NPT.

CAUTION

Use only new black iron or steel pipe. Internally tinned copper or copper tubing can be used per National Fuel Code, section 2.6.3, providing gas meets hydrogen sulfide limits, and where permitted by local codes. Gas piping system must be sized to provide minimum inlet pressure (listed on data plate) at the maximum flow rate (BTU/hr). Undue pressure loss will occur if the pipe is too small.

CONNECTING TO GAS SUPPLY

▲ WARNING: A qualified service person must connect appliance to gas supply. Follow all local codes.

Installation Items Needed

Before installing the Outdoor Fireplace, make sure you have all items listed bellow:

- piping (check local codes)
- sealant
- manual shutoff valve
- adjustable (crescent) wrench or pliers
- sediment trap
- tee joints
- pipe wrench

▲ CAUTION: Use only new, black iron or steel pipe. Internally tinned copper tubing may be used in certain areas. Use pipe of 1/2" diameter or greater to allow proper gas volume to Outdoor Bonfire. If pipe is too small, undue loss of pressure will occur.

Installation must include a manual shutoff valve, union, and plugged 1/8" NPT tap. Locate NPT tap within reach for test gauge hook up. NPT tap must be upstream from the appliance.

Apply pipe joint sealant lightly to male threads. This will prevent excess sealant from going into pipe. Excess sealant in pipe could result in a clogged burner injector.

Install sediment trap in supply line as shown below. Locate sediment trap where it is within reach for cleaning and trapped matter is not likely to freeze. A sediment trap traps moisture and contaminants. This keeps them from going into Outdoor Fireplace controls. If sediment trap is not installed or is installed wrong, unit may not run properly.

CHECKING GAS CONNECTION

A WARNING: Test all gas piping and connections for leaks after installing or servicing. Correct all leaks at once.

A WARNING: Never use an open flame to check for a leak. Apply a mixture of liquid soap and water on all joints. Bubbles forming show a leak. Correct all leaks at once.

Test Pressures in Excess Of 1/2 psi (3.5 kPa)

The appliance and its individual shutoff valve must be disconnected from the gas supply piping system during any pressure testing of that system at test pressures in excess of $\frac{1}{2}$ psi (3.5 kPa).

Test Pressures Equal To or Less Than 1/2 psi (3.5 kPa)

The appliance must be isolated from the gas supply piping system by closing its individual manual shutoff valve during any pressure testing of the gas supply piping system at test pressures equal to or less than $\frac{1}{2}$ psi (3.5 kPa).

LIGHTING INSTRUCTIONS

FOR YOUR SAFETY **READ BEFORE OPERATING**

WARNING: If you do not follow these instructions exactly, a fire or explosion may result causing property damage, personal injury, or loss of life.

- A. This appliance is equipped with an ignition device which automatically lights the pilot. Do not try to light the pilot by hand.
- B. BEFORE OPERATING smell all around the appliance area for gas. Be sure to smell next to the floor because some gas is heavier than air and will settle on the floor.

WHAT TO DO IF SMELL GAS

- Do not try to light any appliance.
- Do not touch any electric switch.
- Do not use any phone in your building.
 Immediately call your gas supplier from a neighbor's phone. Follow the gas supplier's instructions.
- If you cannot reach your gas supplier, call the fire department.
- C. Main gas valve in this appliance is not serviceable and does not have any control knobs or switches to operate. Do not remove heat shields covering the valve and electronic devices; do not try to repair or modify the valve as it may result in a fire or explosion. Call a qualified service technician if you have any safety concerns.
- D. Do not use this appliance if any part of it has been under water. Immediately call a qualified service technician to inspect the appliance and to replace any part of the control system and any gas control which has been under water.



DANGER: Never use an open flame to check for gas leak.

INITIAL LIGHTING

Purge air from the supply line as follows:

- · Open main shutoff valve.
- · Unscrew main pressure test point.
- · Leave inlet test screw open until gas comes in.
- When gas is flowing, tighten inlet screw immediately.

LEAK TESTING

- 1. Follow the pipe from the gas supply line connection to the gas valve. Check connection for leaks with soap and water mixture.
- 2. Next check for gas leaks at the burner with soap and water mixture.
- 3. Check the pilot for gas leaks with soap and water mixture.

APPROVED LEAK TESTING METHOD

You may check for gas leaks with the following methods only:

- Soap and water solution
- An approved lead testing spray
- Electronic sniffer

WARNING: If using a soap and water solution to test for leaks, DO NOT spray solution onto electronic parts.

LIGHTING INSTRUCTIONS Continued





NOTE: Remove any excessive pipe compound from the connections. Excessive pipe compound can set off electronic sniffers.

Check for gas leaks in each of the following locations:

- Pipe from the gas supply line connection to the gas valve
 - Burner connections, pilot
 - All joints on valve and control body
 - · Field made joints / gas shutoff valve
 - · Factory made joints, each joint and connection





- 1. Turn off all electric power to the appliance if service is to be performed. Unplug 7V DC adapter from the power outlet.
- 2. If necessary, remove access panel from the appliance to access manual shutoff valve on gas line.
- 3. Open access panel. Turn the manual gas shutoff valve clockwise
- 4. If necessary, close access panel.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS



1. STOP! Read the safety information on reverse side.

- 2. Turn off all electric power to the appliance.
- 3. Do not attempt to light the pilot by hand.
- 4. Open access panel. (See Illustrated Parts List
- 5. Turn the gas control manual valve clockwise to the full OFF position.
- 6. Wait five (5) minutes to clear out any gas. Then smell for gas, including near the floor.

If you smell gas, Stop! Follow "B" in the safety information

If you don't smell gas, go to the next step.

- 7. Turn the gas control manual valve counterclockwise to the ON position.
- 8. Plug supplied 7V DC adapter into 110V power outlet.
- 9. Connect the wire to the DC input plug at the unit.
- 10. Turn on all electric power to the appliance.
- 11. Close access panel.
- 12. Locate ON/OFF switch outside the appliance.Turn it to ON.
- 13. The pilot should start sparking and then the pilot flame will appear. The main burner should ignite within 4 seconds.
- 14. If the appliance will not operate, follow the instructions "To Turn Off Gas To Appliance" and call you service technician or gas supplier.

CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE

WARNING

Turn off gas before servicing fireplace. It is recommended that a qualified service technician perform these check-ups at the beginning of each heating season.

BURNER, PILOT AND CONTROL COMPARTMENT

Keep the control compartment clean by vacuuming or brushing at least twice a year Make sure the burner porting, pilot air opening and burner air opening are free of obstructions at all times.

PILOT FLAME

The flames from the pilot should be visually checked as soon as the unit is installed and periodically during normal operation. The pilot flame must always be present when the fireplace is in operation or connected to the gas line with main shutoff valve open and the IPS activated (powered). The pilot flame has two distinct flames, one engulfing the flame sensor and the other reaching to the main burner.



BURNER

The flame from the burner should be visually checked as soon as the unit is installed and periodically during normal operation.

Keep the appliance and its burner clean by vacuuming or brushing at least twice a year. Make sure the burner porting and burner air openings are free of obstructions at all times.

Inspect area around the burner. Remove any lint or foreign material with a brush or vacuum.

The burner must be replaced prior to the appliance being put into operation if it is evident that the burner is damaged. Please refer to "Illustrated Parts List" for the replacement part number specified by the manufacturer.

ELECTRICAL WIRING



This fireplace requires 110V AC electrical supply for normal operation in order to power up 7V DC adapter which is required to operate Remote Control. However, during power outage situation, its electronic system (DFC board) can be temporarily powered with 6V DC battery pack (4 AA batteries).

Electrical connections should only be performed by a qualified, licensed electrician. Main power must be off when connecting to main electrical power supply or performing service. All wiring shall be in compliance with all local, city, and state codes. The appliance, when installed, must be electrically grounded in accordance with local codes, or in the absence of local codes, with the *National Electrical Code ANSI/ NFPA* 70 (latest edition) and Canadian Electrical Code, CSA C22.1.

CAUTION

Label all wires before disconnecting when servicing controls. Wiring errors can cause improper and dangerous operation.

TROUBLESHOOTING

WARNING: Turn off the unit and let cool before servicing. Only a qualified service person should service and repair this appliance.

BASIC WARRANTY

Woodbridge Fireplace Inc. warrants the components and materials in your gas appliance to be free from manufacturing and material defects for a period of two years from date of installation. After installation, if any of the components manufactured by Woodbridge Fireplace Inc. in the appliance are found to be defective in materials or workmanship, Woodbridge Fireplace Inc. will, at its option, replace or repair the defective components at no charge to the original owner. Woodbridge Fireplace Inc. will also pay for reasonable labor costs incurred in replacing or repairing such components for a period of two years from date of installation. Any products presented for warranty repair must be accompanied by a dated proof of purchase.

This Limited Lifetime Warranty will be void if the appliance in not installed by a qualified installer in accordance with the installation instructions. The Limited Lifetime Warranty will also be void if the appliance is not operated and maintained according to the operating instructions supplied with the appliance, and does not extend to (1) firebox/burner assembly damage by accident, neglect, misuse, abuse, alterations, negligence of others, including the installation thereof by unqualified installers, (2) the costs of removal, reinstallation or transportation of defective parts on the appliance, or (3) incidental or consequential damage. All service work must be performed by an authorized service representative.
